### HOW GC WORKS

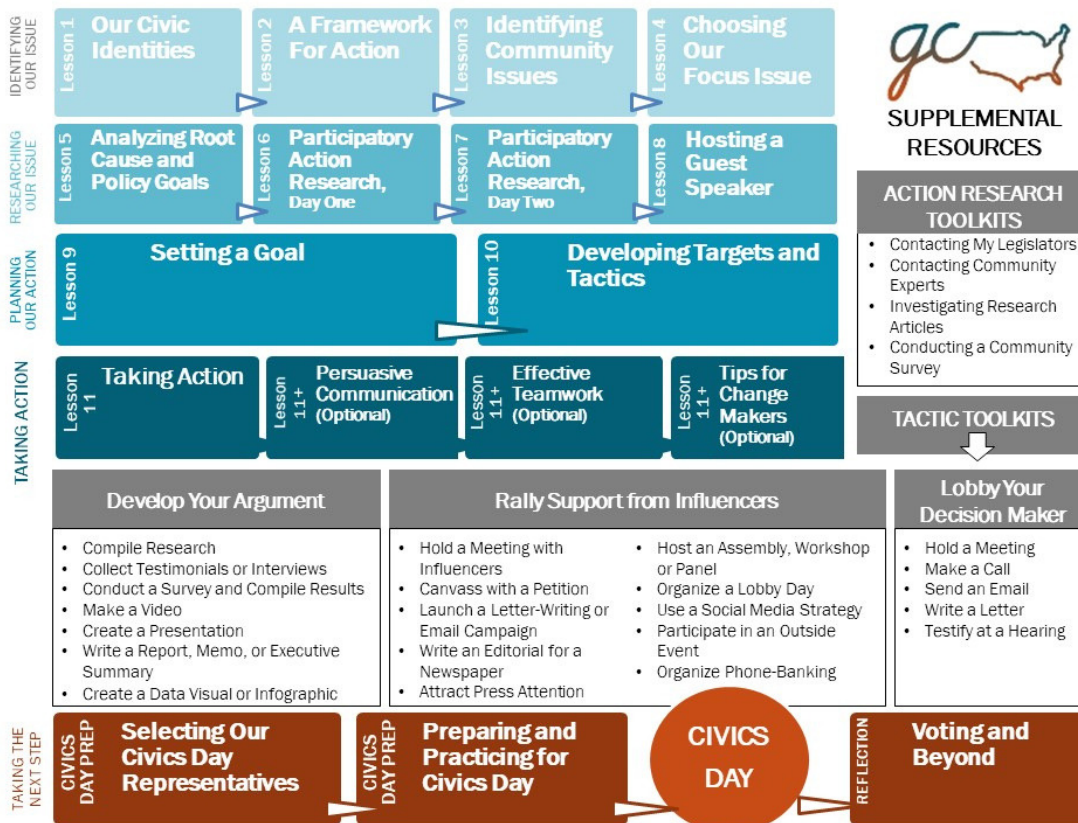
- Partner with schools to implement *Action Civics in Participation in Government (PIG)*, social studies, history, and/or elective classes for 6th-12th graders.
- Teach our standards-aligned curriculum in class twice weekly over the course of a semester.
- Host “*Civics Day*,” an end-of-semester student showcase in which classes present their projects to community leaders.

### PROGRAM BENEFITS

- *Teacher Professional Development:* Teachers receive comprehensive training and resources to support the delivery of a high-quality Action Civics program.
- *Local Advocacy Project Support:* Site staff support the development of each class project through locally-compiled advocacy resources.
- *Strategic Planning & Capacity Development:* GC works to develop a plan to release responsibility to schools after a multi-year partnership.
