21st Century Grant:

The Writing Institute at Sarah Lawrence College will convene creative writing workshops to students in grades 1-8 at Ella Fitzgerald Academy for a morning session (five days a week) and an afternoon session (twice per week). As expressed in the grant proposal, the purpose of this program is "engaging reluctant writers in experiences that foster expression and love for the written word."

Title I:

Since 2007, Sarah Lawrence College has partnered with Yonkers Public Schools to provide creative writing workshops for middle school and high school students. These workshops serve as both enrichment programs for students interested in creative writing as well as rigorous instruction in close reading, the elements of craft and exposure to multiple literary genres.

Students are provided instruction in reading and writing creative works of poetry, short stories, memoir, graphic novels, and other genres. The workshop experience includes facilitating discussions of student work to provide feedback for revision and progress on creative writing pieces. Above all, the creative writing workshop model seeks to empower students to express themselves and understand the power of storytelling.

2. AMOUNT OF SERVICE?

21st Century Grant:

The consultant day rate for is \$344 per workshop for morning sessions, which includes one lead teacher and one assistant teacher to conduct two concurrent workshops. For the afternoon sessions, the consultant day rate is \$250 per workshop, which includes two co- teachers to conduct two consecutive workshops. Please note the volume of sessions required (216 workshops over 18 weeks) precludes this day rate from including supplies, transportation for teaching artists or staff administrative time.

Title I:

Each creative writing workshop is a 5-week afterschool program, for two hours each week. The workshops serve 12 to 15 students each, and are co-taught by two MFA in Writing students from Sarah Lawrence College. For 2022-2023, we are proposing two workshops for high schools students (in February & April), and two workshops for middle school students (in February & April).

These workshops took place virtually in 2021 & 2023. Workshops can be offered at Sarah Lawrence College in 2022 & 2023, but all participants must show proof of vaccination or a negative Covid-19 test within 72 hours of the event, per <u>Sarah Lawrence College campus policy</u>. Transportation is not included. For 2022-2023, Sarah Lawrence College students are available to teach on site at a designated YPS school if that would be preferable.

The contract also includes scholarships for up to 10 YPS students to attend Writers Week (dates TBA) in Summer 2023, a weeklong day camp (10:00am to 5:00pm) on campus at Sarah Lawrence College. Writers Week participants must show proof of vaccination or a negative Covid-19 test within 72 hours of the event, per Sarah Lawrence College campus policy. If participants cannot meet these guidelines, they may be invited to participate in our virtual Writers Week program (dates TBA).

The full program (four workshops and Writers Week scholarships) will serve 60 to 72 YPS students.

Writing workshop teachers are hired, trained and managed by the Writing Institute at Sarah Lawrence College. Teaching artists include Sarah Lawrence College MFA Writing graduate students and alumni; MS Art of Teaching graduate students; and Writing Institute teaching artists. Each teaching artist will bring an expertise and professionalism necessary for conducting youth workshops. They are trained by Courtney Gillette, Director of the Writing Institute, who holds an MS in Urban Education from Mercy College and an MFA in Creative Writing from Lesley University

Title I:

Writing workshop teachers are hired, trained and managed by the Writing Institute at Sarah Lawrence College. These teachers are part of the Sarah Lawrence College MFA in Writing graduate student cohort and bring an expertise and professionalism necessary for conducting youth workshops. They are trained by Courtney Gillette, Director of the Writing Institute, who holds an MS in Urban Education from Mercy College and an MFA in Creative Writing from Lesley University.

Sarah Lawrence College will communicate directly with parents/students about the workshops and any necessary details/follow up information. The program will culminate with a celebration of the students' work in the form of an anthology and/or celebratory event.
