The purpose of the Yonkers City School District (YCSD) P20 Urban Leadership Academy Program, is to develop a research-based and field-tested model for providing a time-effective, costeffective principal preparation program to teachers who desire to move into educational leadership positions, and one that addresses the specific concerns of leading schools within an urban city setting and targets a population of potential school leaders from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds.

There are six, main outcomes associated with this proposed 2-year, grant cycle project:

- 1. The program comprehensively addresses the 11 core elements as outlined in the grant request for proposal;
- 2. Bank Street, YCSD and NYCLA representatives and recruited participants engaged in planning meetings that developed the parameters of the leadership program;
- 3. During year 1, the program was registered with NYSED;
- 4. All students will be provided with ongoing support to secure their SBL certification, including study sessions for the SBL exams;
- 5. The leadership program is designed to address the specific context of leading in an urban school setting;
- 6. The cohort of students represent the diverse ethnic and cultural makeup of our schools and our city.

For year two of the program:

- Bank Street will provide admissions, registration and financial aid support to all the participating students.
- Bank Street, with YCSD, will refine the process to make decisions on each participant's mastery of individual competencies and summative judgments of candidate readiness to be recommended for certification as a School Building Leader based upon our collective learning.
- Bank Street, with YCSD, will refine the internship learning experiences for aspiring principals based upon our collective learning about the discrete needs of individual students.
- Bank Street, with YCSD, will examine and strengthen the assessments used in the yearlong coursework and in supervised fieldwork. The assessments will vary in format so that the partnership will have a holistic view of the candidates' readiness for leadership at the school building level.
- Bank Street will provide support to YCSD instructors in the form of daily debrief sessions, course content adjustment guidance, and calibration of assignment grades to the competency rubric.
- Bank Street will provide support to YCSD instructors in the form of aiding and coaching them in learning to provide meaningful and timely feedback to candidates.

- Bank Street will provide support to YCSD instructors as they provide timely and meaningful feedback to candidates as they complete the residency change projects.
- Bank Street, with YCSD and NYCLA, will support the school-based mentors and coaches.
- Bank Street, with YCSD, will create a reporting process that will inform NYSED of the identification, development, and placement of school leader candidates as well as the overall program.
- Bank Street will work with YCSD to design a plan to build the sustainability of the program.

Bank Street will provide service to members of the YSCD central staff, to the program facilitators, to the school-based mentors, and to students in the program.

He has also been a cluster and network leader, an instructional superintendent, a principal, and a facilitator of citywide professional development. Dr. Conelli has his Doctor of Philosophy from New York University.
- Nicole Limperopulos is an instructor and Co-Director of the Education Leadership Programs at Bank Street Graduate School. Most recently, she served as the Associate Director of the Summer Principals Academy at Teachers College. Dr. Limperopulos completed her doctoral studies at Teachers College, Columbia University and her research focuses on the ways in which Black and Latino boys navigate the complexities of gun violence.
- Nancy Mann has over three decades of school leadership in urban education. Lead teacher at Central Park East Secondary School. Co-founder and principal of Fannie Lou Hamer Freedom High School. Deputy Superintendent for the New York City Department of Education. Mentor to educators and school leaders in New York City. Co-creator and co-instructor of Summer Principals Academy Competency-based program at Teachers College.
